

A MESSAGE FROM THE PKSCA BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Since our founding in 1988, PKSCA cultural and humanitarian activities have run the gamut from exchanges to celebrations. **2017 in review:**

Victory Day (often referred to in Russia simply as “The 9th of May”)—a major Russian holiday celebrating the heroic Soviet role in the defeat of Hitler—was celebrated at PSU’s 5th Ave. Cinema with commemorative poetry, snacks & refreshments, and the showing of an award-winning WWII Soviet film.

PKSCA joined a *World Friendship Day* event at Westminster Presbyterian Church on May 13th. The event brought together most of Portland’s sister city associations with other international friendship organizations for a fun and informative exchange of culture and ideas.

June’s *Rose Festival* parade featured a sister cities “pedicab float” entry, with Natalie Verdi and Natalia Hougén in festive native costumes representing PKSCA. PKSCA members also took part in a Sister Cities Reception at City Hall.

President Alan Ellis headed a delegation to Khabarovsk’s *Day of the City* celebration in June. The visit provided an opportunity to establish plans for continued youth, musical and arts exchanges through 2018.

November’s *Bridge to Russia* celebrated 29 years of sister city partnership. The gala event was held at Portland’s Old Church and featured Russian performers Andrei and Natasha Pavlov and Three for Silver’s Willo Sertain, Lucas Warford and Greg Allison—the local Portland band that PKSCA sponsored to serve as delegates and performers at Khabarovsk’s Day of the City spring festival in 2016.

ABOUT KHABAROVSK

KHABAROVSK (HA-BA-RUVSK) IS PORTLAND’S SISTER CITY IN THE RUSSIAN FAR EAST. OUR CITY HISTORIES HAVE MANY SIMILARITIES. KHABAROVSK, AN INLAND PORT CITY ON THE CONFLUENCE OF TWO MAJOR RIVERS, FOUNDED IN 1858, OFFERED EASTWARD PIONEERS ABUNDANT NATURAL RESOURCES: GOLD, TIMBER & SALMON. NAMED FOR THE 17TH CENTURY EXPLORER YEROFYEV KHABAROV, KHABAROVSK IS A TERRITORIAL CAPITAL, POPULATION 800,000, AND A MAJOR CENTER OF INTERNATIONAL CULTURE & COMMERCE. KHABAROVSK, LOCATED ON THREE HILLS OVERLOOKING THE AMUR RIVER, WAS FIRST ESTABLISHED AS A MILITARY OUTPOST IN 1651, DURING THE FIRST WAVE OF RUSSIAN COLONIZATION. IT GAINED IMPORTANCE IN THE NINETEENTH CENTURY AS A TRADING OUTPOST AND TODAY IS ONE OF THE MOST PROMISING CITIES OF THE RUSSIAN FAR EAST.

What is PKSCA?

The Portland-Khabarovsk Sister City Association (PKSCA) was formed June 10, 1988 as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization to foster international friendship through cultural & educational exchange and to facilitate social & economic ties between the citizens of our two communities. We are a self-governing board operating under a city ordinance which requires us to be both financially independent of and accountable to the Mayor of Portland. PKSCA is entirely dependent on contributions from its members, supportive businesses and organizations, and fund-raising events. (nonprofit EIN = 93-0981758)

PKSCA is governed by a Board of Directors. (Honorary Directors are designated from time to time for their service in achieving the PKSCA mission.) A Board member serves a three-year renewable term, participating in scheduled meetings and helping to further the PKSCA mission. Board members nominate candidates to fill vacancies on the Board, with a simple majority vote needed for approval. *If you have an interest in serving on the Board, please contact PKSCA President Alan Ellis for details at aje0280@gmail.com or by phone at 503-287-0477.*
